FINGERPRINT ACTIVATED PROXIMITY ACCESS CARDS NON-TRANSFERRABLE, HIGH SECURITY APPLICATIONS

How to set-up your IP-VIP™ card

Once the IP-VIP[™] card has been Fingerprint enrolled, it can only be used in High-Security mode. Only the person with their finger enrolled on that specific IP-VIP card can use it.

It can never be re-enrolled for someone else. It will NOT work unless the named authorised person activates it using their enrolled finger.

If lost, stolen, passed to a friend it CANNOT be used – even if the system administrator does not delete the IP-VIP card number from the IPGUARD® / BATICONNECT access control system.



STEP 1. SYSTEM ENROLMENT

Place the un-enrolled IP-VIP card on any proximity reader controlling entry through any door. This proximity reader will usually be one that is located near to the concierge / system administrator offices because they will always need to verify that it has been set-up in high-security mode by a specific named and authorised person.



STEP 2. SCAN YOUR FINGER

Keep the IP-VIP card in place on the proximity reader (using your other hand) to keep it powered. A blinking green LED will indicate it is ready for enrolment. Place your chosen finger on the sensor – the LED will briefly flash faster to confirm a successful fingerprint capture.



STEP 3. REPEAT

Lift your finger from the sensor, keeping the card on the proximity reader. Place it back on the sensor and wait until the LED briefly flashes faster. Repeat lifting and placing your finger until you get a single long green pulse.



STEP 4. DONE

You can now use your IP-VIP card if a green LED flashes when you place your enrolled finger on the fingerprint sensor. If a solid red LED appears, the IP-VIP card will not work because your finger is not authorised.
